Individuals with disabilities face an alarming unemployment rate over 70%. This underserved population requires additional supports to be trained for, retain, and maintain employment. MVLE's Employment Services offers part-time and full-time employment options to provide more meaningful opportunities for our individuals. As our industry is evolving, it is important that we enhance our workforce development efforts. MVLE is expanding our partnerships to support these efforts including computer training, hands-on skill building and career transition support.

To fully realize our vision and ensure the people we serve are given opportunities to grow both personally and professionally, MVLE has embraced a socialenterprise model, a commercial business strategy with a mission of creating employment. Through this lens, we are actively exploring commercial strategies, including Digital Stream, our document scanning and conversion service, and Ability Nation, our line of scented home goods. This past year, MVLE enhanced the workforce development in our Printing, Mailing & Warehouse divisions, both of which are staffed by individuals in our programs. These individuals employed in these divisions are developing skills that are transferable to job opportunities in our local business community.






INTEGRATION

Visit MVLE's Community Centers during the week and you might hear someone playing the guitar or the latest Justin Timberlake dance song. These sounds represent the energetic environment at MVLE that encourages our individuals to express themselves through music, art and dance.

The goal of our Support Services program is to promote community integration for individuals served, while also providing needed therapies to assure development of functional self-help and daily living skills that promote independence and quality of life. To achieve this, MVLE partners with several organizations including A Place to Be (APTB) and Body Wise. Working with APTB, MVLE's clients are guided through therapeutic activities by the students and volunteers. These activities provide an opportunity to socialize while engaging in interactive activities that enhance their quality of life. This year Body Wise developed the MVLE Moves program, which works to achieve powerful physical, social, and emotional benefits for staff and clients. Not only does this program benefit our clients' physical well-being, but also their mental health and emotional well-being. This will better prepare our individuals to be productive members of their community, working to achieve their personal and professional goals.

GOVERNMENT

This year MVLE was excited to partner with California State University of Los Angeles for the SourceAmerica Design Challenge. The SourceAmerica Design Challenge is a national engineering competition aimed at creating innovative workplace technology for people with disabilities. The team of engineering students from CalState worked alongside individuals in MVLE's program and our employment partners to understand some of the challenges they were facing at work. The students then created four tools that would assist our individuals on the jobsite and increase their overall productivity. The MVLE, Be All You can Be Team, took home Second Place in this National Competition!

MVLE's government partnerships extend beyond the halls of the General Assembly in Richmond, to our government contracts employing 84 individuals across our region and nation. Our participation in the AbilityOne network has grown over several years and serves to enhance our employment offerings. In 2012, MVLE saw the rise in transitioning military members and veteran unemployment. MVLE understood this was another part of our community that was facing similar barriers to employment that individuals with disabilities had often faced. MVLE sought to close this gap by providing support and services aiding the transition to the civilian workforce. Through our government contracts, MVLE was able to work both with the veteran and the employer to foster an inclusive and thriving employment relationship.

By connecting area veterans to employment and brokering training opportunities with area companies, MVLE helps returning servicemen and women regain their footing as they take the next step in their lives.
