
Inclusive Performing Arts

MVLE Moves provides a creative outlet for individuals with disabilities to explore and showcase their artistic abilities. Thanks to the support of loyal partners, MVLE Moves continues to grow and reach new audiences across our region. This Spring, the cast debuted our third original production, "Rookies' First Feast."

This year we also celebrated our newly renovated performing arts studio space! Located at MVLE's Business Center in Springfleld, VA, this performance studio will serve as rehearsal space for the MVLE Moves performance group as well as space for our new partnership with Fairfax County Therapeutic Recreation Department. Together with BodyWise Dance, we host SPOTLIGHT — a performing arts workshop series for individuals with disabilities across our larger community.













Innovation

MVLE Innovation Lab

The Innovation Lab will serve as an incubator to continue growing our latest initiatives, such as the MVLE Moves performing arts program, and MVLE Farms, our hydroponic garden; as well as, foster new program ideas and partnerships.

MVLE Farms is set up with detachable vertical grow towers. The towers can be removed and placed on a work table where employees of all abilities will be able to plant or harvest the produce. Through the MVLE Farms training program, inalividuals will develop transferrable work skills to build community employability.

Dining with Purpose

What an electric evening MVLE had for our 2nd annual Farm to Table dinner on April 28! Over 85 guests dined



with us for amazing food, great wine, and even better conversation! The food was outstanding, but more importantly the community was engaged and excited to learn more about MVLE's mission.

Employment & Workforce Development

Over 80% of individuals with disabilities are unemployed and we are striving to innovate new approaches to changing that statistic. With our new mission statement, MVLE is expanding our stakeholder group to include those facing other barriers, beyond disabilities. This expanded reach will allow MVLE to bring our expertise to those falling through the gaps in current service options.

This year, MVLE launched MVLE Resources for Independence and Successful Employment (RISE) Program to serve the TANF (Temporary Assistance for Needy Families) population in Loudoun County. Funded through a grant from the Virginia Department of Social Services, MVLE RISE program provides work readiness services, assistance with job placement and retention, benefits planning (if needed), and supports to link with other services needed to maintain employment in the area.

MVLE expanded employment partnership with Northern Virginia based business, Lend-A-Box. Currently, six MVLE individuals work once a week for two hours helping to clean and prep the moving boxes. "Partnering with MVLE has allowed us to create a weekly job opportunity for the six individuals that make up our amazing box cleaning crew. And, because we restructured the process in how we clean boxes, our MVLE crew is more efficient and the boxes are cleaner than the way we used to do it! Our crew rocks our warehouse every week!" — Stephanie Zimmermann, Owner, Lend-A-Box
